Welcome to Pueblo

Pueblo, known as the "Home of Heroes," welcomes Recycle Colorado, the heroes of recycling, materials management and waste diversion to our community! Pueblo is pleased to host the 2019 Summit for Recycling after a seven-year hiatus. Since the Summit was last held in Pueblo in 2012, there have been many changes in our community. Although, rest assured, the views of the mountains, river, arroyos and prairies have stayed the same.

One of the newest enhancements is the expanded Pueblo Convention Center. Pueblo's proposal for the convention center expansion was the first entry selected in the Colorado Regional Tourism Act grant competition. The ribbon cutting for the three-year, 52,000-sq.-ft. expansion project was May 11, 2019.

Another major change for Pueblo was the election of the first mayor since 1911! The City of Pueblo Public Works Department was awarded a 2017 RREO grant to build "Pueblo RecycleWorks," a public drop-off center for sorted recyclable materials. Streetscaping has increased, PaintCare has added recycling drop sites and the CSU-Pueblo campus has a new student center and research facility.

As noted in the regional tourism grant application, "from bull riders to soldiers to steelworkers to athletes, (Pueblo's) heritage is embodied by the heroes of everyday individuals whose extraordinary efforts have made this the vibrant community it is today." We hope all you 'green heroes' enjoy Pueblo's mild climate, lovely Historic Arkansas Riverwalk, vibrant outdoor art and delicious cuisine. Have a great conference!

2019 Summit for Recycling

Thank you for joining us for the 30th annual Summit for Recycling. We truly appreciate our sponsors, our business partners and our many volunteers, without whom the Summit would not be possible. From here, Recycle Colorado will do what we do best and create tangible, actionable and measureable projects to bring stakeholders together to solve for the current issues. Over the next two days, we urge you to engage with our speakers and experts and take full advantage of the tours and networking opportunities.


